## ABOUT THE KENNEDY CENTER ALLIANCE FOR ARTS EDUCATION NETWORK

The Kennedy Center Alliance for Arts Education Network (KCAAEN), a program of the Kennedy Center Education Department, is a coalition of statewide not-for-profit Alliances for Arts Education working in partnership with the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts to support policies, practices, programs, and partnerships that ensure the arts are an essential part of American K-12 education.

The mission of the KCAAEN is to advance learning in and through the arts for all students. To meet the following program objectives, members of the KCAAEN in partnership with the Kennedy Center will

1. **BUILD COLLABORATIONS:** Develop and support innovative collaborations among schools, community partners, and cultural institutions that sustain arts education.
2. **POSITION THE ARTS:** Speak out on behalf of arts education to citizens, policy makers, state agencies, and others about the value and benefits of arts education.
3. **GENERATE RESOURCES:** Develop, publish, and/or disseminate resources for arts education leaders and practitioners.
4. **PROVIDE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT:** Implement professional development through educational programs, training, and resources.
5. **RECOGNIZE INNOVATION AND ACHIEVEMENT:** Provide awards and acknowledgements to individuals, organizations, and schools that demonstrate outstanding support for arts education.

## INTRODUCTION

This booklet is a compilation of State Alliance Profiles from 2009-2010. It includes information from 32 of the State Alliances as of December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2010. The individual State Profiles contain information about numbers of individuals served, budgets, major collaborations and programs, as well as other information. During 2009-2010, the State Alliances of the Kennedy Center Alliance for Arts Education Network reached a total of 1,787,022 people:

Educators (9 or more contact hours)	6,042
Educators (9 or fewer contact hours)	6,272
Artists	2,673
General Public (directly)	43,900
General Public (indirectly)	1,728,135

The Alliances also have made an impact through membership campaigns and collaborations with other organizations. The Alliances secured a total of 17,144 memberships (11,553 individual, 4,396 organizational, 1,195 honorary) and initiated collaborations with over 144 organizations. Alliances hosted conferences, events, and implemented professional development programs ranging from USDE Model Development and Dissemination projects; to professional development conferences for teachers, artists, or other arts education professionals; to awards programs for students, educators and citizens; to public awareness campaigns. The Alliances operated with revenue totaling \$7,104,603 for FY10.

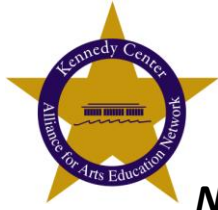
