In past years, she has received grants from both the DC Commission on the Arts and Humanities and the Artist-In-Education Program for the Maryland State Arts Council. She is an artist educator with Imagination Quest, Imagination Stage, and is on the artist roster with the Louisiana Division of the Arts and Maryland State Arts Council. Imani's debut book and compact disc entitled *Dhimiki* has received raved reviews from teachers and students. Her latest work, entitled *Iyipo Ayé*, is now available with a sing-a-long compact disc.
